
The DC Collaborative for Mental Health in Pediatric Primary Care's Child & Adolescent Mental Health Resource Guide

The DC Collaborative for Mental Health in Pediatric Primary Care aims to improve the integration of mental health in pediatric primary care for children in the District of Columbia. We have a strong commitment to addressing the mental health needs of diverse children, from birth through 20, and their families, through culturally competent, family-focused initiatives. The Collaborative is a multidisciplinary group, comprised of the following lead organizations, and guided by a Community Advisory Board: Children's Law Center, Children's National Health System, DC Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, DC Department of Behavioral Health, DC Department of Health, DC Department of Health Care Finance, and Georgetown University.

OVERVIEW OF GUIDE AND REFERRAL PATHS 1

Introduction

This guide aims to provide a comprehensive listing of community behavioral health resources for children and adolescents in the District of Columbia. While comprehensive, the listing is not exhaustive. This is a working document, and will continually be updated. The main scope is on those providers in the District of Columbia that serve children and families on Medicaid. However, some providers in Maryland and Virginia are included, as well as a few providers across the D.C. area that offer services on a sliding fee scale or accept commercial insurance. A separate section includes some providers that accept self-pay or commercial insurance only.

Each major section and sub-section includes the following information about each organization:

- Organization: Address, phone number, website and public transportation access.
- Services: Brief description of services provided and languages other than English available.
- Ages Served: The age ranges of children and adolescents the organization serves.
- <u>Insurance, Referral and Availability</u>: Insurances accepted, whether a referral is required and general appointment availability. Given that this information can change quickly, and sometimes daily, we strongly recommend calling to verify.
- Note about "Unable to verify:" Throughout the guide, entries contain the language "unable to verify." This means that we have contacted the organization to obtain the listed information, but the organization has not responded to our request.

Referral and Treatment Paths:

The D.C. Medicaid program has different paths for accessing mental health treatment, depending on the severity of a beneficiary's mental health condition. Based on a positive behavioral health screen indicating the need for further assessment, a primary care provider may make a referral to a behavioral health care provider in a Medicaid managed care organization or Medicaid fee-for-service network, or to a Core Service Agency (CSA). Please see below for further information.

- 1. <u>Medicaid Managed Care Organization Beneficiaries</u>. People enrolled in a Medicaid managed care organization can receive office-based treatment through mental health providers who are in the managed care organization's provider network. Office-based treatment includes therapy, medication management, and day treatment programs. Patients also have a right to care coordination, language translation services and transportation assistance. Beneficiaries must locate a provider who participates in each MCO's network:

- 2. <u>Core Service Agencies</u>: A primary care provider may make a referral to a Core Service Agency (CSA) for a diagnostic assessment. Generally, to then receive services at the CSA, a child must be given a severe social/emotional disorder diagnosis. The Department of Behavioral Health (DBH) administers different types of therapeutic interventions delivered by its contract providers Core Service Agencies, sub-providers and specialty providers. These are known as Mental Health Rehabilitation Services (MHRS), and provide community-based or in-home services for children with severe social/emotional disorder diagnoses. Available services include diagnostic assessments, medication management, counseling, community support, community-based interventions, day services, and crisis intervention. Providers who offer the four "core services" (diagnostic assessments, medication management, community support, and counseling) are classified as CSAs; those providers who offer a subset of these core services (e.g., assessment and counseling) can be certified as a sub-provider or specialty.
- 3. <u>Fee-for-Service Beneficiaries</u>. People with disabilities and children in formal state custody (such as Child and Family Services Agency (CFSA) or Department of Youth Rehabilitation Services (DYRS)) may be enrolled in fee-for-service (FFS) Medicaid (or known as Straight/Regular Medicaid). These individuals can receive all of their mental health services through the Department of Behavioral Health's provider network of core service agencies, or they can connect to free-standing mental health clinics for office-based services. You can also contact DC Department of Health Care Finance regarding mental health services for FFS beneficiaries at 202-698-2000.

Core Service Agency Referral

Provide at least the four core services:

- Diagnostic assessment
- Community support
- Medication management
- Counseling (select CSAs also provide evidence-based practices such as Trauma-Focused CBT and Child Parent Psychotherapy)

After an assessment, generally to continue receiving services at a CSA, the child must have a serious emotional disturbance diagnosis.

SCHOOL-BASED MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES & ADVOCACY

The School Mental Health Program promotes social and emotional development and addresses psycho-social and mental health problems that become barriers to learning and arise in the school setting. The SMHP serves youth, families, teachers and school staff in the DC Public Schools and DC Public Charter Schools. There are tiered levels of intervention:

<u>Tier 1</u>: A clinician is available to the school on a full-time basis to provide prevention, early intervention and treatment services. Existing schools that have demonstrated high utilization of the program, and new schools who have enrollment of at least 200 students, demonstrate a readiness for the SMHP program, and have identified need through a needs assessment process will qualify for consideration for tier 1 service. <u>Tier 2</u>: A clinician is available to the school on a part-time basis to provide prevention, early intervention and treatment services.

COMMON DISORDERS & TREATMENT MODALITIES

- 1) ADHD symptoms benefit most from psychopharmacological intervention (particularly stimulant medication) with or without behavior therapy (the latter especially beneficial in the context of comorbid psychiatric disorders, family stress or suboptimal response to medication). Behavioral parent training may include guidance on home token economy and enhanced school-home communication (classroom accommodations including use of daily classroom behavioral report card).
- 2) Disruptive Behavior Disorder (including Oppositional Defiant Disorder, Conduct Disorder, and anger management problems) include symptoms of oppositionality, angry or vindictive behavior, problems with temper control or aggression (verbal and / or physical).
 - a. **Parent Management Training**, including Parent-Child Interaction Therapy, aims to support the caregiver in reducing positive reinforcement for negative behavior, increasing positive reinforcement for prosocial and compliant behavior and providing consistent limits.
 - b. Problem-Solving Skills Training introduces children to five steps to handle hypothetical and real-life problematic situations.
 - c. **Multi-Systemic Therapy** provides extensive and intensive treatment (case management, family interventions, prosocial activity) in the child's own psychosocial environment.
 - d. **Functional Family Therapy** is an intervention for the treatment of violent, criminal, behavioral, school, and conduct problems with youth and their families.
 - e. Medication is ineffective as monotherapy but may be considered as an adjunctive treatment when therapies are insufficient.
- **3) Anxiety Disorders** involve excessive fears that may be generalized or that may be focused on varying themes including separation from caregivers or social situations.
 - a. Exposure-based **Cognitive Behavioral Therapy** (CBT) equips children with coping skills and provides practice in developing a sense of mastery over anxiety triggers and symptoms.
 - b. With moderate or severe anxiety or symptoms persistent despite regular psychotherapy, **SSRI**s are considered first-line psychopharmacologic intervention.
- **4) Depression** may manifest as depressed or irritable mood in the context of loss of interest in previously enjoyed activities or changes in sleep, appetite, energy and concentration; also of concern are suicidal ideation or attempt.
 - a. **Psychoeducation, supportive management and simple case management** (relating to family or school stress) are reasonable initial interventions for mild depression.

- b. **Cognitive Behavioral Therapy** (CBT) involves cognitive restructuring (changing negative thinking patterns) and behavioral activation (engaging in positive activities).
- c. Interpersonal Therapy (IPT) directly addresses interpersonal conflicts or deficits, role transitions, or grief.
- d. **SSRI**s are considered first-line psychopharmacologic intervention.
- **5) Trauma Disorder** symptom clusters include re-experiencing of the trauma, persistent avoidance of trauma reminders or negative alterations in cognitions and mood, and persistent symptoms of hyperarousal.
 - a. **Trauma Focused- Cognitive Behavioral Therapy** (TF-CBT) introduces stress-management skills with exposure-based interventions with the objective of providing a sense of mastery over trauma reminders.
 - b. **Child-Parent Psychotherapy** targets younger children (younger than age 7 years) and their parent with focuses on the attachment relationship, processing traumatic grief, and emotional and technical support to the dyad.
- **6) Autistic Spectrum Disorder** symptoms include social communication deficits and restricted, repetitive behaviors in the early developmental period.
 - a. **Applied Behavioral Analysis** (ABA) involves functional analysis of maladaptive behaviors and utilization of targeted behavioral techniques to provide desired behavioral alternatives generalizable to other areas of life.
 - b. **Pivotal Response Treatment** (PRT) focuses upon target behaviors with a more child-driven approach (child's own interests and situation determining behavioral activities and rewards).
 - c. Communication skills are enhanced and optimized in **Speech and Language Therapy** while this intervention is widely accepted as beneficial, diversity of models lends to smaller mass of research studies and therefore weaker evidence base.
 - d. Contingent upon the child's level of function, **Social Skills Groups** may provide education and practice on social reciprocity- while this intervention is widely accepted as beneficial, diversity of models lends to smaller mass of research studies and therefore weaker evidence base.
